Report from The Community Foundation

About 35 members participated in our first Zoom meeting that included speaker Dan Layman of the Community Foundation of the Central Blue Ridge. The Foundation serves Staunton, Waynesboro and surrounding counties and has been mobilizing local resources to meet the needs of people impacted by COVID-19. Dan described how organizations are distributing food, assisting with rent, housing the homeless, providing health care, assisting small businesses, and offering free counseling for people suffering from social isolation and mental health issues. Looking ahead, Dan also talked about how a series of phased relief efforts will need to extend into the future.

Courts in the Time of COVID-19

Commonwealth Attorney David Ledbetter joined the Zoom meeting today to give us an update on how the court system is coping during the pandemic. Courts were shut down for over a month but trials are beginning to take place again both in person and remotely. The court system is finding some advantages to the use of technology that will probably be continued but jury trials remain a problem and will be delayed until late summer or early fall. The population of the overcrowded Middle River jail was reduced by releasing nonviolent offenders and those with less than 30 days left to serve.

Update from the Boys and Girls Club

Tom Hardiman, who serves as treasurer for the board of The Boys and Girls Club, joined us today to talk about the fire at the East Main Street location. The club had been closed from the time the school system shut down but was just starting to provide children care for essential workers when a fire gutted the kitchen early on May 15th. Water and smoke damage was extensive and a complete overhaul of the facilities will be needed. This provides an unexpected opportunity to reconfigure the spaces and create a community resource center.

Insurance will cover much of the repairs, but the club is hoping to raise an additional \$10,000 through a GoFundMe account to cover unexpected expenses and upgrades.

Brain Carlton, who served as managing editor of the News-Virginian from 2013 to 2016, was able to join us via zoom from NC. Brain reported that while 20% of small local newspapers have folded in the last 20 years, many more have been bought up by large corporations whose bottom line he characterized as "prestige above profit". Typically reporters have been cut as corporate management salaries have gone up. This has led to fewer stories, especially local news. Brian feels that poor financial planning is a bigger factor than lack of reader interest when it comes to the demise of newspapers.
