Dr Deborah Walters, Former DG for Maine/Quebec and Rotary Global Woman of Action in 2015, talked briefly about her 2,503 - mile kayak fundraiser completed in 2017. Then she focused upon her current work with BPD ("BAY-PAY-DAY" or ALDEA) and efforts to win district and global Rotary grants to work with Mayan villages where as many as 90% of children suffer long term effects from chronic malnutrition.
