# Notes from the Board




Children of essential workers in YMCA childcare pack lunches for the homeless

The board has been meeting virtually to carry on club business. In this unprecedented time board members, under Lowrie's leadership, wanted to make major contributions to local agencies meeting the needs of people impacted by the pandemic. With support from the Trustees the board approved these donations: \$5,000 each to Valley Pastoral Counseling Center, Valley Hope Counseling Center, Salvation Army, YMCA and WARM; \$1,000 to United Way and \$3,000 to Valley Program for Aging. This added up to a grand total of \$29,000!

Rebecca Shin applied for and won a special COVID-19 grant offered by District 7570. The **\$1400** will go toward the "Lunches for Locals Experiencing Homelessness" project. The YMCA has been providing lunches to approximately 37 folks housed at the Days Inn and this money will support that project. Children at the YMCA help to pack the lunches and Zeh's Plumbing has been delivering them.

The board has received notice that Norm Anderson, upon his death, left \$15,000 to the Waynesboro Rotary Foundation.



#### In Memoria

Forest Arehart, who was a member of our club for 40 years, passed away on April 4<sup>th</sup>. Forest was a native of Augusta County and founded Arehart Associates, a CPA firm here in Waynesboro. He was involved in a number of civic organizations and served on City Council. Forest helped organize the noon-time basketball group at the YMCA where he played until he was 70 years old. Forest lost his wife Betty in 2017. Our sympathies go to his family and friends.

## Women in Rotary

Women were not allowed membership in Rotary until 1987 and even then, it did not come without a fight. After the Rotary Club of Duarte CA invited three women to become members in 1978, their charter was revoked and they filed a suit that went all the way to the US Supreme Court. The court ruled that since Rotary has a "business purpose" and is a public-type organization that such discrimination was unlawful. Doris Hulvey and Mary Ann Everly-Maupin were admitted to our club as the first women members in 1988. Kathleen Heatwole was our first woman president in 1994/95. You can read more about all three at the blog on our website. Currently we have 23 women in our club, accounting for about a third of the members.
