Former President Tracy Blido joined us to talk about her firsthand experiences when she traveled there to see how schools, trade schools and animal husbandry can contribute to political stability and financial security.	
November 18 th	Stephanie Aubert joined us from Grasshopper Landing, a farm in New Hampshire dedicated to introducing children, particularly from the underserved community, to the natural world. She gave us a theoretical framework for regenerative agriculture, ecological literacy and community transformation. Regenerative agriculture for example, would not only produce food, but also improve the quality of air, water and soil at the same time. Summer camps and afterschool programs	

are designed to get kids involved at an early age. Stephanie is currently working on developing an archive of educational materials.
