August 10 th	Riley Wagner: Skelton/Jones District 7570 Scholarship Applicant Lora Hamp introduced Riley Wagner. Our club will be supporting his application for a \$35,000 scholarship to do graduate work in England. Riley attended WHS and went on to get a degree in engineering at Princeton. He has worked in both Peru and Argentina to develop sustainable systems that provide clean drinking water for rural communities. His goal is to work in developing nations to create a net zero economy. Riley is an impressive mix of scholarship and service!
August 17 th	Diana Williams on Local Schools Safiya Jarvis introduced Diana Williams, past chair of the Waynesboro School Board, who brought us some updates from our local system. We have a diverse group of about 3,000 students who speak 13 languages. All students are offered a free breakfast and lunch paid for by grants because of the high percentage of needy children in our area. Diana reported that teacher recruitment and retention is good, but bus drivers are needed. The biggest challenge? Underfunding, of course.
August 24 th	Catching up with LIFEworks AJ and Adrianne Young provided an update about their latest project – the River City Bread Basket. They began by reminding us of why they started their nonprofit: to Lift up neighbors, to Inspire, to Fulfill needs, and to Empower others. Food insecurity is one of their biggest concerns. They are already involved in delivering food to public housing in the area, but they are now creating a local "client choice food pantry" where families can come during convenient hours. They have a number of partners, but seek additional funds and volunteers.
August 31 st	Black Bear Composting If you have no space or desire to compost on your own, you can contract with Black Bear to pick up yard wastes and food scraps. Eric Walter joined us today to talk about the business that he started in 2010. Black Bear collects food from restaurants, schools (such as UVA), and grocery stores; combines it with leaves and mulch; and creates rich compost in 3 to 4 months at their facility north of town. Food dumped

into your trashcan ends up in landfills where it emits methane gas – much worse than carbon dioxide for the environment.





Shenandoah National Park Updates

On The Road Collaborative Gets \$8,000

Patrick Kennedy, Superintendent of Shenandoah National Park, joined us today. He shared some history of the park, established in 1935, and why a park in the Eastern United States was needed at a time when most National Parks were out west. He talked about the challenges faced by SNP and how visitation will soon be limited at Old Rag – one of the areas that is getting "loved to death". Patrick also pointed out how local communities benefit from the tourists' dollars. We are fortunate to have such a natural resource close by!
